This series holds the Society's photographic prints, along with original drawings and reproductions. The contents range from late 19<sup>th</sup> century carte-de-visite portraits to late 20<sup>th</sup> century snapshots of Ham and Bean Suppers, showing events, people and places about Kingston. Like other series, "Images on Paper" contains rich documentation of the Pilgrim Tercentenary, which sparked interest in early American history around the nation, most particularly in southeastern Massachusetts.

Nearly 600 images have been cataloged and can be searched electronically in the same database as the general LHR photo collection. Every print resides in archivally-sound envelopes or folders, arranged sequentially by a unique identifying code which describes its general category and the collection to which it belongs. The JRVHS images are used in research and exhibits under the same conditions as LHR collections, but when published, must be credited to the Society.
